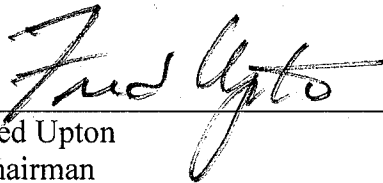
Pursuant to Rules X and XI of the U.S. House of Representatives, the Committee on Energy and Commerce is examining the recent outbreak of a lethal form of Shiga toxin-producing *E. coli* O104:H4 (STEC O104:H4) in Europe. As of June 6, 2011, case counts confirmed by Germany's Robert Koch Institute include 642 patients with hemolytic uremic syndrome – a type of kidney failure that is associated with *E. coli* or STEC infections – and 15 deaths. We are especially concerned by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) report that, in the United States, there are one confirmed and three suspected cases of STEC O104:H4 infections identified in persons who recently traveled to Hamburg, Germany, the likely site of exposure.¹

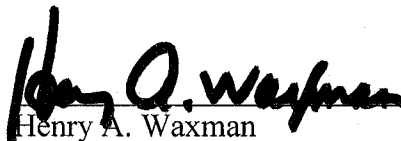
