“Examining Professional Ethics and Industrial Hygiene” is August 31st

FAIRFAX, VA (June 13, 2011) — The American Industrial Hygiene Association[®] (AIHA) will host “Examining Professional Ethics and Industrial Hygiene”, an introductory TeleWeb Virtual Seminar, on August 31, 2:00 - 4:30 pm ET. The featured Teleweb, sponsored by the JIHEEC committee, is presented by David C. Roskelley, MSPH, CIH, CSP; Glenn J. Barbi, CIH; Lynn O’Donnell, CIH; Jeff V. Throckmorton, CIH; and Alan J. Through this TeleWeb the practitioner will gain an understanding of Ethical Behavior and the factors that influence it. The seminar will review recent changes in the ABIH Code of Ethics and consider tools and methodologies to resolve Ethical Dilemmas.
