AIHA[®] Presents a Virtual Symposium on Noise Exposure
Take a New Look at Determining Occupational Noise Exposure

FAIRFAX, VA (October 6, 2011) — The American Industrial Hygiene Association[®] (AIHA) will host a two day virtual symposium on occupational noise exposure and noise hazards. John C. Ratliff, CSP, CIH, MSPH; William Carter, Ph.D; and Sharon Kujawa, Ph.D will direct the workshop presentations which will include a working knowledge of the physics of noise, the anatomy and physiology of human hearing, and the benefits of hearing prevention programs.

This symposium will provide the participant with a working knowledge to apply noise principles to their own practice. The presentation and the interaction by the participants will give the participant the ability to understand the information from any noise survey or dosimetry study, and to do those studies. The researchers will provide insights to new research that has shown noise to be more hazardous than currently portrayed by the profession. It will also show the participant how they can apply what they learn to their own special situations.
